Evidence of leadership in the MRT profession
With CAMRT through committee or task group work:
As the Chair of the Best Practice Guidelines Committee, I work with the CAMRT and an interdisciplinary team of MRT's from across the country. Together, we help create and maintain resources to help guide practice and enhance decision-making.
With a Provincial Organization through service on their board or committees:
I have prior experience volunteering with the NBAMRT on the Public Relations committee. The committee worked with the executives to enhance member engagement and produce promotional materials.

The Nuclear Medicine training program encompassed numerous stakeholders, including hospitals, radiologists, The University of New Brunswick, The New Brunswick Community College, the NBAMRT and the CAMRT. I also worked with training programs from different disciplines to provide clinical experiences for their students. I strive to create a safe space for my colleagues and patients to discuss their concerns and ideas.
